

Closing Eucharistic Celebration & Reaffirmation of Officers


League sisters love to sing and rejoice! On Wednesday their voices filled the air, jubilantly and powerfully as they celebrated the conclusion of the national convention.

There was lively debate on the floor over the resolutions presented by the resolutions committee. Two resolutions were passed:

- 2013.01 Building Relationships and Partnerships with Canada's Indigenous Peoples. (Community Life)
- 2013.02 Employment Insurance Benefits for Cancer Patients and Their Caregivers (Legislation)

Anne Chase, a 15 year cancer survivor and 50+ year member, gave an enlightening presentation on ovarian cancer awareness and prevention.

Maribeth Stewart, WUCWO vice-president for North America, spoke of WUCWO's organizational structure and encouraged members to attend the upcoming WUCWO Regional North American Conference in Fort Lauderdale, FL.

National officers continued presenting their annual standing committee reports. Velma Harasen gave a follow up presentation on Velma's Dream and her trip to Israel, encouraging members to continue to pray for Christians in the Holy Land.
