9Brief:Canada to Honour its Commitment to the United Nations Convention on the10Rights of the Child

The Declaration of the Rights of the Child was drafted by the United Nations Commission on 11 12 Human Rights and adopted by the United Nations General Assembly on November 20, 1959. The 13 third whereas clause of the declaration states, "the child, by reason of his physical and mental 14 immaturity, needs special safeguards and care, including appropriate legal protection, before as 15 well as after birth" (UN OHCHR). Further to the declaration, the Convention on the Rights of the 16 Child was adopted and opened for signature ratification and accession by the United Nations 17 General Assembly on November 20, 1989. Canada signed the Convention on the Rights of the Child on May 28, 1990, and legally bound itself to the document by ratifying it on December 13, 18 19 1991 (UN Treaty Collection Chapter IV).

20 All countries had the opportunity to register reservations regarding the convention. "A reservation 21 enables a state to accept a multilateral treaty by giving it the possibility not to apply certain 22 provisions with which it does not want to comply" (UN Treaty Collection, Glossary). Canada 23 submitted only two reservations, neither of which referenced the legal protection of children before 24 birth. According to the UN Treaty Collection, Glossary, a state party's signature "...is a means of 25 authentication and expresses the willingness of the signatory state to continue the treaty-making 26 process. The signature qualifies the signatory state to proceed to ratification, acceptance or 27 approval. It also creates an obligation to refrain, in good faith, from acts that would defeat the 28 object and the purpose of the treaty" (Complied by Arts.10 and 18, Vienna Convention on the Law of Treaties 1969). The glossary defines ratification as, "...the international act whereby a state 29 30 indicates its consent to be bound to a treaty if the parties intended to show their consent by such 31 an act.... The institution of ratification grants states the necessary time-frame to seek the required 32 approval for the treaty on the domestic level and to enact the necessary legislation to give domestic 33 effect to that treaty" (Complied by Arts.2 (1) (b), 14 (1) and 16, Vienna Convention on the Law of 34 Treaties 1969). The UNICEF Introduction to the Convention on the Rights of the Child reiterates 35 that "Ratification' is an act by which a State signifies an agreement to be legally bound by the 36 terms of a particular treaty" (UNICEF). It has been 28 years since Canada ratified the Convention 37 on the Rights of the Child and yet the necessary Canadian legislation to protect children before 38 birth still has not been enacted.

Canada has no law protecting children before birth. The *Criminal Code* of Canada states in section 223(1), "A child becomes a human being within the meaning of this Act when it has completely proceeded, in a living state, from the body of its mother...". Section 223(2) reads, "A person commits homicide when he causes injury to a child before or during its birth as a result of which the child dies after becoming a human being" (Canada). These statements do not recognize or legally protect the child before birth.

- 45 Canada signed and ratified the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, without
- 46 reservation on the legal protection of a child before birth. This makes Canada legally bound to
- 47 honour its commitment, not only to Canadians, but to the world.
