Marriage and Family

"The 10th World Meeting of Families (WMF) will take place in Rome, June 22-26, 2022, under the theme, *Family Love: Vocation and Path to Holiness*. Pope Francis has announced that this event will be held in a new way; celebrated not only in Rome, but in all dioceses and eparchies across the world. Organized by both the Diocese of Rome and the Dicastery for the Laity, Family and Life, the WMF coincides with the close of the '*Amoris Laetitia* Family Year.'" The website romefamily2022.com has resources suitable for all ages to prepare for and take part in the WMF.

Many other resources are available, including a national online rosary scheduled for June 19th. More information on the WMF and activities for the Year of the Family is available also from the Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops (cccb.ca) under Faith & Moral Issues – Family and Life.

Youth: World Youth Day is an international gathering of young people aged 16-35, though all are welcome to attend. It will be held August 1-6, 2023, in Lisbon, Portugal. Councils are encouraged to support youth in their parish to participate in this gathering.

Seniors: National Seniors Day on October 1st is an occasion where members can join in celebrating older adults. Please encourage members to acknowledge seniors and their contributions to society and how much they are appreciated.
