It is with great joy that the implementation committee announces the selection of the women who will join the 25 women already working on members' behalf. This now brings to 54 the number of women working on the implementation of the strategic plan. Seven working groups have been established in this the second year of the implementation of planning strategically in the League. A short description of each working group and the selected members for each strategy are listed below.

Goal 1 Strategic Leadership – to help members grow in faith and develop leadership skills

This strategy will capitalize on members' willingness to take on short-term leadership responsibilities. The working group will identify criteria for short-term leadership needs and opportunities by researching and developing strategies to attract members for different levels of engagement and short-term commitments. Goal 2 Catholic Social Teaching – to focus on Catholic social teaching

This strategy will "empower members by providing educational opportunities to learn more about Catholic social teaching [CST]" and begin a four-year task to identify and communicate its principles. The working group will generate an extensive list of resources available on educational opportunities to learn about CST. It will also, each year, identify resources already in existence that are specific to two of the seven key principles of CST. Goal 3A - League Misconceptions - to focus on outreach and service

The group will use information about past and present League accomplishments to create an awareness program and publish monthly quizzes. Goal 3B - Encourage Diversity

The working group seeks to increase participation of diverse cultural and generational groups by encouraging and creating mechanisms to embrace diverse cultures and ages. The group will research ways to increase diverse cultures and ages within the League and suggest concrete ways to implement those strategies. Goal 3D - Spiritual Formation

The working group will develop spiritual programs for distribution at all levels as a way to provide opportunities to increase women's spirituality as a core objective. Spiritual programs will be developed using a variety of formats, and will include media-rich and non-media options as well as the small Christian community model of "pray, reflect, act." The group will encourage councils to focus on the spiritual and social aspects. It will review existing League materials, research available copyright-free sources, and will develop/write new spiritual programs for distribution.
