Greetings, sisters in the League!

September often presents an overwhelming array of activities as schedules and routines begin again after the summer break. Social justice activities are not an exception. The <u>Calendar of Social Justice/Catholic Social Teaching in the Church</u> on the national website may be helpful to focus reflections and actions for the month and throughout the term.

The <u>Season of Creation</u> began September 1st with the World Day of Prayer for the Care of Creation and concludes on the feast day of St. Francis of Assisi (October 4th). This year's theme is *Let Justice and Peace Flow*. It calls us "to renew our relationship with our Creator and all creation through celebration, conversion, and commitment together" and offers opportunities to pray and take action ecumenically for our common home.

Pope Francis' message on the theme is, "It is necessary to stand with the victims of environmental and climate injustice, striving to end the senseless war on our common home, which is a terrible world war. I urge all of you to work and pray for it to abound with life once again." The website has information and suggested activities linked to this year's theme that councils could perhaps reflect on with their members.

Note of Interest: Pope Francis has announced that the second part of the encyclical <u>Laudato Si'</u> will be published on October 4th. It will focus on the climate crisis.

Resolution 2023.01 Combating Textile Waste in Canada was adopted at the 103rd national annual meeting of members in Saint John, New Brunswick. This resolution addresses the concern that textile waste is for Canada. With your diocesan counterparts, please encourage members to reflect on following up on the action plan recommendations.

<u>Truth and Reconciliation</u>: In June 2021, the federal <u>Bill C-5</u> An Act to amend the Bills of Exchange Act, the Interpretation Act and the Canada Labour Code (National Day for Truth and Reconciliation) received royal assent to make September 30th a federal statutory day of observation as the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The federal government describes this day as honouring "the children who never returned home and Survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process." More information and suggestions for activities can be found on the government's <u>website</u>.

The <u>Canadian Conference of Catholic Bishops</u> (CCCB) issued four pastoral letters in 2023 on reconciliation with Indigenous peoples, titled "That We May Walk Together." For more information on the vision forward for *Truth and Reconciliation*, read the CCCB letters.
