

The majority of Canadians are concerned that medical assistance in dying (MAiD) has risks of a needless death for vulnerable Canadians, such as the elderly, people with disabilities and those with chronic illness.

Are you listening to the voices of Canadians?



Two-thirds of Canadians (65%) are concerned that the criteria in the current legislation for MAiD may increase pressure on people, such as those with disabilities and the elderly, to seek death needlessly.

Sixty-eight per cent of Canadians want their political leaders to pay attention to the April 2019 United Nations report that criticizes Canada's lack of implementation of safeguards to protect people with disabilities and ensure access to supportive care.

More than one-half (55%) of Canadians worry that MAiD may take the place of adequate social services.
